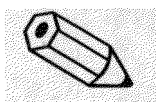


## Progress Test 1 (Self-Assessment)

The following exercises are written; try to do them without looking anything up.

1) Put the following sentences into the negative:

- a) Paul has a new bicycle
- b) We must go now
- c) Do you know where the town is? (Only first verb to go into negative!)
- d) They go shopping every Saturday morning
- e) I wish you could come! (Only first verb in the negative).

2) Turn the following sentences into questions:

- a) We don't know what you are talking about
- b) I have some exciting news for you!
- c) Mary writes very neatly
- d) We ought not to go
- e) The train travels at more than 100 miles per hour

3) Put the following verbs into the continuous form (verb ending **ing**):

- a) Paul is a great nuisance
- b) They do not have any trouble
- c) The plane travels at supersonic speed
- d) At what time do you reach home?
- e) We get our lunch at about midday

4) Make up sentences including the following prepositions:

- a) on top of; behind; with; down; after; until (5 marks each)

5) Replace the following verbs with verbs with the same meaning plus a preposition and use them in sentences to bring out the meaning. Sometimes there is a choice of meanings! The verb to use is given but you must fill in the preposition:

Example: continue – go \_\_\_\_\_; the lesson **goes on** without interruption.

- a) happen - come \_\_\_\_\_ b) become - turn \_\_\_\_\_  
c) leave - go \_\_\_\_\_ (two prepositions);  
d) die - pass \_\_\_\_\_ e) remove - take \_\_\_\_\_

6) Fill in the gaps with the appropriate demonstrative pronoun or adjective: sometimes there is more than one answer.

Example: I want these (adjective) apples more than those (pronoun)

(You don't need to state 'adjective' or 'pronoun' as long as your sentence makes clear which is which!)

- a) I like \_\_\_\_\_ (plural) better than \_\_\_\_\_(plural).  
b) \_\_\_\_\_ car is the best I have driven!  
c) Which cake do you want, \_\_\_\_\_ one or \_\_\_\_\_?  
d) \_\_\_\_\_ people over there are the ones I met last week.  
e) \_\_\_\_\_ girl recognized me; but I don't think I knew her from \_\_\_\_\_ others.
